




What are the types of boats?

Pleasure crafts (rowing and sailing units, motor units with hull length not exceeding 10 meters).

Pleasure ships (units with a hull length exceeding 24 meters, which will not be considered in this guide).



The obligation of registration applies only to boats and ships. Dinghies do not need to be registered, although they may be registered at the owner's discretion.



When can registration be useful?

For dinghies, registration can be useful in case of change of ownership:



proving the change of ownership is more difficult as it relies on good faith and/or a suitable document to prove the transfer of ownership.

Registered dinghy:

a modification in the register at the office where the dinghy's registration was made is required.



When can registration be useful?

If the dinghy is registered, it is subject to the legal regulations for pleasure boats:

- Obligation of periodic equipment and safety checks
- Production of mandatory documents

Documents required for registration:

- Ownership title of the unit (public deed, authenticated private deed, and registered).
- ► EU conformity declaration of the boat issued by the manufacturer or private importer.
- Engine power declaration or declarations of conformity issued by the manufacturer, or engine homologation certificate.
- Copy of the purchase invoice or fiscal receipt demonstrating compliance with tax and possibly customs obligations.
- Declaration of assumption of responsibility regarding events arising from the operation of the unit.



Temporary Registration

By submitting the documents for registration, it is possible to obtain the temporary registration of the vessel and the assignment of the registration number, and the following are then issued:

- Provisional navigation license
- Safety certificate

It is important to underline that, after six months from the assignment of the registration number without the ownership title being presented, the registration is considered not to have occurred, and the owner must return the provisional license and the safety certificate to a Telematic Desk.





FOREIGN CITIZENS OR RESIDENTS ABROAD

Italian citizens and residents of other European Union Member States residing abroad, but who wish to register or maintain the registration of their boats in the telematic archive, must establish a domicile in Italy or appoint a representative with a domicile in Italian territory. The choice of a representative with a domicile in Italy is also required for citizens and companies from non-EU countries, in order to provide the authorities with a point of reference for any communications.





Documents required for navigation:

If the dinghy is registered, it is subject to the legal regulations for pleasure boats:

- ▶ Boat License: Essential beyond 6 miles, regardless of engine power.
- RID Extract: History of ownership transfers.
- Navigation License: With registration number, it authorizes the pleasure craft.
- Safety Certificate: Issued by the S.Te.D, it attests to the vessel's compliance.
- Power Declaration: Declares engine power and displacement, required on board.
- Insurance Policy: Covers third-party liability for damages.
- RTF License: Certifies VHF suitability, necessary for navigation.
- ► CE Conformity and Marking: Safety requirements for boats up to 24 meters.
- Owner's Manual: Contains understandable instructions and safety information.



Annual tax on pleasure craft

Hull length	Annual tax
from 14,01 to 17 meters	870 euros
from 17,01 to 20 meters	1.300 euros
from 20,01 to 24 meters	4.400 euros
from 24,01 to 34 meters	7.800 euros
from 34,01 to 44 meters	12.500 euros
from 44,01 to 54 meters	16.000 euros
from 54,01 to 64 meters	21.500 euros
over 64 meters	25.000 euros



The tax is reduced by 50% for sailing units with auxiliary motor, whose ratio between sail area and engine power (expressed in Kw) is not less than 0.5.



It is also reduced:

- by 15% after 5 years from the date of construction of the pleasure craft
- by 30% after 10 years from the date of construction
- by 45% after 15 years.

These periods start from January 1st of the year following the construction year.

FRANCE		 A registration fee + annual engine power tax is paid → may be a good option for catamarans and sailboats Registration times range from 2 to 4 weeks The vessel must have been built within the European Union, or import taxes must have been paid within the EU. If the vessel has a crew, at least 35% of it must be composed of EU citizens.

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
